The Lenivan Empowerment Foundation continues to drive its mission of empowering dreams, illuminating destinies, and transforming humanity through education. In 2025, we have strengthened our commitment to creating equitable access to learning opportunities for vulnerable children and marginalized communities across Kenya. This report highlights the progress made across our core programs and outlines our financial stewardship, reflecting our vision for the future.

Our Progress

- We have increased the number of scholars supported from 40 to 44 under the Beyond Barriers Scholarship Program.
- We have provided holistic scholar support, including school fees, shopping, fare, and essential learning materials.
- We have distributed monthly food stipends through the Happy Plates Initiative to ensure consistent access to nutritious meals.
- We have successfully delivered a second batch of school shoes in January through the Steps of Hope Initiative, enhancing school attendance and student comfort.
- We have launched our official Instagram and LinkedIn pages, amplifying our storytelling and community engagement efforts in January.
- We have conducted on-ground visits to deepen relationships with our beneficiaries and better understand their needs.

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) remind us that the challenges we see in our communities are not isolated, they are global. At Lenivan Empowerment Foundation, these goals guide the work we do every day, ensuring that our programs respond to real needs in practical, meaningful ways. Below are the Key SDGs that we focus on.



End Poverty in all its forms everywhere.

Poverty remains a major barrier to education in Kenya with families being forced to choose between food, housing and education. As a foundation we address three sub targets of this goal – 1.2, 1.4 and 1.A.



End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture

Many children in Kenya go to school hungry, which affects their concentration, energy, and academic performance. Hunger leads to school dropouts and stunted growth. As a foundation, we address two sub-targets of this goal – 2.1, 2.2.



Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all

Education is the most powerful tool for breaking the cycle of poverty. However, financial barriers and a rigid academic system prevent many children from accessing opportunities. As a foundation we address three sub targets of this goal - 4.1, 4.5 and 4.7.

Expand Acess to Scholarships	 Awarded scholarships to 4 more students, thus increasing the number of our scholars from 40 to 44, enabling them to focus on their studies without financial worry. Promoted our scholarship program on social media to attract more applicants
Strengthen scholar support	 Provided 4 scholars with school shopping and fare apart from tuition fees.
Enhance Monitoring and Financial Compliance	 Developed a financial tracking system to monitor school fee payments and debts. Ensured timely payments for school fees and food stipends.
Ensure consistent access to nutritious meals for children in underserved communities.	 Distributed on-time monthly food stipends to all school meals program recipients.

Improve school attendance and comfort for primary school students through shoe distribution. Distributed a second batch of school shoes to primary school students at the Center of Hope School in January funded by the main sponsor Underwriting Africa Specialty Limited together with key partners including Newpoint Reinsurance and IRM Insurance Brokers Private Limited

Increase awareness of the program's impact.

We are proud of the steady progress made across all program areas this year. From scholarships and school materials to meals and shoes, each effort contributes to our wider goal of making education more accessible and equitable. Our team remains dedicated to improving systems and expanding our reach, one child at a time.

Consistent, targeted support is what sets our foundation apart. By building strong relationships with schools and communities, we're able to respond to real needs and track our impact effectively. Whether through a new pair of shoes or a monthly food stipend, every action counts toward our mission. The goals outlined in the table above are not isolated achievements - they are part of a bigger journey toward educational equity.

Financial statistics

Our foundation continues to strengthen its financial sustainabilitiy, ensuring that every dollar impacts the lives of the students we support one way or another. Our funds are strategically allocated across our three core initiatives and organization operations. The Beyond Barriers scholarship program utilises 41% of our finances, while the Happy Plates and Steps of Hope iniatives use 16% and 32% respectively. The remaining 11% is used to meet the organizations operational expenses





Program statistics

This year, we hope our programs reach more students, demonstrating the tangible impact of our initiatives. Currently there are:

- 44 number of scholars
- 34 number of scholars that will benefit from the coming mentorship program
- 10 number of primary school students benefiting from the Happy Plates initiative
- 124 number of students benefiting from the 2024 Shoe Drive

They will also reinforce the importance of community relationships in shaping responsive and effective programs.

- Academic tracking and mentorship programs have been strengthened to ensure students not only stay in school but excel in their studies



Enhancing Well-being & Dignity (SDG 2 – Zero Hunger & SDG 3 – Good Health & Well-being)

- Served thousands of nutritious meals through the Happy Plates Initiative, ensuring students can learn without hunger.
- 90% attendance rates have been maintained in supported schools due to consistent meal provision.
- The Steps of Hope Initiative has provided 124 children with quality shoes, reducing health risks and improving self-esteem.
